VACCINATIONS FOR STUDENTS IN PREPARATION TOWARDS LIFE WITH COVID-19

Brunei Darussalam has entered the endemic phase commencing on 15 December 2021. In preparation towards the endemic phase, students aged 12 to 17 years nationwide have completed two doses of COVID-19 vaccine under the National Vaccination Programme. The first and second doses of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine were administered from 8 to 19 November 2021 and 6 to 15 December 2021 respectively.

The National Vaccination Programme was organised by the Ministry of Health, in cooperation with the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Religious Affairs, aiming to curb the spread of COVID-19. The programme also helped the country to achieve its vaccination rate target.

As early as 7.15am, students from all schools nationwide, accompanied by one of their parents or guardians, were already queueing at designated vaccination centres for their jab appointment. In all four districts, eight venues were selected for vaccination centres, particularly the Indoor Stadium, Hassanal Bolkiah National Sports Complex; Universiti Brunei Darussalam; Jubli Emas Health Centre Bunut; Medical Reception Station (MRS) Bolkiah Garrison; Dewan Seri Kenangan, Pekan Tutong; Learning and Development Centre (LDC), Hospital Suri Seri Begawan; Panaga Health Centre; and Dewan Kemasyarakatan Belalong, Pekan Bangar.

Whole-of-Nation Approach

All vaccination centres aimed to cater all students from all four districts. In light of this, officials including school leaders, teachers, staff and volunteers from the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Religious Affairs lent their support during the implementation of the vaccination programme. Different tasks were assigned and delegated including scheduling time slots, providing transportation to the vaccination centres, checking student attendance as well as preparing and distributing packs of food and drinks for students. The effort was part of the whole-of-nation approach in ensuring the standard operating procedure was being adhered to and the registration as well as vaccination processes for all students run smoothly and efficiently.

Principal of Sekolah Menengah Sayyidina Abu Bakar Madam Sia Ai Chin made sure that all instructions and information from the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health were well received and acted upon. She said, "As a school leader, I also ensure all relevant data on students are collected and prepared, vital information conveyed and communicated to parents."

"With the full cooperation from parents and teachers, we are able to get all students' data ready. Vaccination schedules for all of our students to be vaccinated are done in an efficient manner. Coordination between frontliners, Ministry of Education officers and school teachers is also well executed on vaccination day. All in all, we have a smooth process from the beginning until the end," she added.

Sharing her experience working at UBD Vaccination Centre was Dayang Hajah Rosediana binti Haji Hidop, a Senior Education Officer at the Department of Co-Curricular Education, Ministry of Education, said, "I was assigned as a focal officer at UBD Vaccination Centre should any matter arise during the programme. My duties also involve monitoring the implementation of the vaccination programme and ensuring the process runs as smoothly as possible."

"Working with frontliners such as doctors, officers in vaccination management and implementation, volunteers and uniformed teams motivates us from the Ministry of Education to work together by contributing our time and energy to our country," she added.
