

Soalan-Soalan Lazim (FAQ) Mengenai Penilaian Sekolah Rendah (PSR) Tahun 2021 Semasa COVID-19



1) Adakah Penilaian Sekolah Rendah (PSR) sesi 2021 masih akan diadakan?

Merujuk pada sidang media situasi terkini jangkitan COVID-19 bertarikh 2 Rabiulawal 1443H bersamaan dengan 9 Oktober 2021M, PSR 2021 secara bertulis adalah digantikan dengan menggunakan kaedah penilaian alternatif iaitu *School Assessed Marks (SAM)*.

2) Mengapakah PSR 2021 secara bertulis tidak dapat diadakan?

PSR tahun 2021 dilaksanakan secara kaedah alternatif, *SAM* dengan mengambilkira situasi penularan pandemik COVID-19 yang masih membimbangkan di samping memberi keutamaan terhadap keselamatan dan kesejahteraan para pelajar serta tenaga pengajar yang terlibat.

3) Apakah yang dimaksudkan dengan *School Assessed Marks (SAM)*?

SAM adalah penilaian berdasarkan pencapaian sebenar pelajar yang merangkumi markah pelajar-pelajar sepanjang sesi persekolahan tahun 2021 melalui Penilaian Kendalian Sekolah (*School Based Assessment*).

Di dalam penilaian *SAM* pelajar tidak perlu hadir ke sekolah untuk menduduki peperiksaan secara bertulis atau bersemuka sebagaimana kelazimannya.



4) Bagaimanakah calon-calon akan dinilai melalui SAM?

Calon-calon PSR 2021 akan dinilai berdasarkan prestasi mereka melalui penilaian kendalian sekolah yang dilaksanakan oleh sekolah masing-masing. Pihak sekolah perlu menyediakan *portfolio* yang mengandungi dua (2) jenis *substantial work*. Pihak sekolah boleh memilih dua (2) atau lebih seperti yang disenaraikan di bawah ini:

- Penilaian / ujian / peperiksaan menggunakan kertas soalan peperiksaan lalu yang lengkap mengikut jumlah komponen mata pelajaran.
- Kombinasi soalan-soalan yang diambil dari kertas peperiksaan yang lalu mengikut format kertas soalan PSR yang lalu.
- Kertas soalan Ujian Kelayakan.
- Kombinasi kertas soalan *Topical Test*.

5) Adakah calon-calon PSR 2021 akan diberikan sijil PSR seperti lazimnya sedangkan mereka tidak menduduki peperiksaan secara bersemuka?

Calon-calon yang menduduki PSR 2021 akan diberikan sijil sebagaimana lazimnya.

6) Bagaimanakah para pelajar berkeperluan pendidikan khas dinilai melalui SAM?

Majoriti calon-calon berkeperluan khas tidak akan mengikuti PSR tetapi adalah dinilai menggunakan kaedah lain mengikut keperluan masing-masing. Walau bagaimanapun bagi sebilangan kecil pelajar berkeperluan khas yang boleh mengikuti PSR, mereka juga akan dinilai menggunakan SAM.

7) Bolehkah anak saya menggunakan keputusan PSR 2021 untuk mendaftar ke Maktab Sains Paduka Seri Begawan Sultan?

Anak Tuan/Puan masih boleh mendaftar ke Maktab Sains PSBS sekiranya memenuhi semua syarat kemasukan ke Maktab Sains PSBS seperti memperolehi keputusan 5 'A' di dalam Peperiksaan PSR 2021.



8) Apakah inisiatif yang diambil oleh Kementerian Pendidikan bagi mendokong pihak sekolah dalam pelaksanaan SAM?

- Sesi kongsisama pelaksanaan SAM telah diadakan kepada pihak sekolah dan guru-guru di peringkat sekolah rendah
- Memberigakan pelaksanaan penilaian SAM melalui wawancara bersama pihak Radio Television Brunei (RTB)
- Mengongsikan himpunan soalan dan jawapan berkenaan SAM melalui media sosial dan laman sesawang Kementerian Pendidikan
- Perkongsian infografik mengenai SAM melalui media sosial dan laman sesawang Kementerian Pendidikan
- Sesi kongsisama kepada ibu bapa dan pelajar-pelajar daripada pemimpin-pemimpin sekolah

9) Adakah kualiti SAM sebanding dengan peperiksaan secara bertulis/bersemuka?

Penilaian SAM akan melalui proses *Quality Assurance* daripada pihak Jabatan Peperiksaan bagi memastikan penilaian yang dilaksanakan oleh pihak sekolah adalah adil, sah dan saksama.

10) Adakah calon-calon persendirian akan mengikut PSR 2021?

Calon-calon persendirian yang telah didaftarkan di dalam PSR 2021 akan dinilai melalui SAM.

11) Bilakah keputusan PSR 2021 akan dikeluarkan?

Keputusan PSR 2021 akan dikeluarkan mengikut tempoh masa yang telah ditetapkan yang akan dimaklumkan melalui saluran media rasmi Kementerian Pendidikan.

12) Di manakah saya boleh memperolehi maklumat lanjut mengenai penilaian SAM?

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) regarding Primary School Assessment (PSR) 2021 during COVID-19



1) Will PSR 2021 still be conducted?

In reference to the press conference on the latest situation of COVID-19 pandemic dated 2 Rabiulawal 1443H / 9 October 2021M, the PSR 2021 written examination is replaced with an alternative assessment method called School Assessed Marks (SAM).

2) Why can't PSR 2021 written examinations be conducted?

PSR 2021 is implemented using SAM as an alternative method, taking into account the worrying situation of the COVID-19 pandemic while prioritising the safety and well-being of students and teachers.

3) What is School Assessed Marks (SAM)?

SAM is an assessment based on the actual achievement of students that includes the marks of students throughout the 2021 school session through School Based Assessment.

Using SAM, students are not required to attend school to sit for the written or face-to-face examination like they regularly do.



4) How are the candidates assessed in SAM?

PSR 2021 candidates will be assessed based on their performance through School Based Assessment conducted by schools. Schools need to provide a portfolio containing two (2) types of substantial work. Schools can include two (2) or more of the following:

- Assessment / test / examination using a complete past examination question paper according to the number of subject components.
- Combination of questions taken from past examination papers using the format of previous PSR question papers.
- Mock Exam question paper.
- Combination of Topical Test question papers.

5) Will PSR 2021 candidates be given a PSR Certificate as usual when they do not sit for the examination face-to-face?

Candidates who sit for the PSR 2021 examination will be given a certificate as usual.

6) How are special education needs students assessed in SAM?

The majority of candidates with special needs will not sit for PSR but are assessed using other methods according to their needs. However, for a small number of special needs students who can sit for PSR, they will also be assessed using the SAM.

7) Can my child use PSR 2021 results to be enrolled in Maktab Sains Paduka Seri Begawan Sultan?

Your child can still be enrolled in Maktab Sains PSBS provided that they meet all the admission requirements to Maktab Sains PSBS, such as obtaining 5 'A' results in the PSR 2021 examinations.





8) What are the initiatives taken by the Ministry of Education to support schools in the implementation of SAM?

- Sharing session on the implementation of SAM are held for schools and teachers of the primary school level
- Socialising SAM assessment implementation through an interview with Radio Television Brunei (RTB)
- Sharing a collection of FAQ regarding SAM through Ministry of Education social media and website
- Sharing SAM Infographics through Ministry of Education social media and website
- Sharing session are held for parents and students with school leaders

9) Is the quality of SAM at par with written/face-to-face examinations?

The SAM will go through Quality Assurance process by the Department of Examination to ensure that the assessment carried out by the school is fair, valid and equitable.

10) Are the private candidates sitting for SAM?

Private candidates who have been registered in the PSR 2021 examination will be assessed using SAM.

11) When will the results of PSR 2021 be released?

The PSR 2021 results will be released accordingly and announced through the Ministry of Education official media platforms.
